GIANTS VS. WASHINGTON

The New York Giants travel to Washington to take on the Washington Football Team on Thursday, Sept. 16 at 8:20 p.m. ET in FedExField. This is the 177th regular season matchup all-time between the two clubs, with the Giants leading the series 104-68-4. The Giants hold a 47-39-2 road record against Washington, including 14-9-1 in FedExField. The Giants look to win their sixth straight against Washington and fourth consecutive game vs. Washington in FedExField.

BIG BLUE BREAKDOWN

6,237

In Week 1 vs. Denver, Daniel Jones eclipsed Phil Simms (6,095) for the second-most passing yards by a Giants quarterback in their first three seasons.

Saquon Barkley has totaled 3,590 yards from scrimmage, ranking sixth behind Victor Cruz (3,629) for the most yards from scrimmage by a Giants player in their first four seasons with the team.

Leonard Williams is tied for the NFL lead among all defensive linemen with 32 quarterback hits since 2020. Williams also led the team in 2020 with a career-high 11.5 sacks.

30

Graham Gano converted 31-of-32 field goals (96.9 percent) in 2020, including each of his last 30. Gano's streak is the longest in franchise history and the longest active streak in the NFL.

James Bradberry has totaled 19 passes defensed since joining the Giants in 2020, which is tied for the third-most in the NFL.

Since 2018, Kenny Golladay's 16.7 yards-per-reception average leads all NFL players with at least 150 catches.

Azeem Ojulari recorded 1.0 sack in his debut in Week 1 vs. Denver and became the first Giants player to log a sack in his first NFL game since William Joseph in 2003 vs. St. Louis. He is only the sixth Giant to notch a sack in his NFL debut.

KEY CONNECTIONS

After not being drafted in the first round of the 2016 NFL Draft, Giants LB **Reggie Ragland**'s first phone call was to Washington S **Landon Collins**, his teammate at Alabama from 2012-14, who had a similar experience in the 2015 Draft. Collins and Ragland were the leading tacklers on Alabama's 2014 SEC Championship team.



Giants K **Graham Gano** spent the first three seasons of his career with Washington and made 59 field goals in 36 games. Gano accounted for 236 total points while with Washington.

Giants CB **James Bradberry** played with Washington QBs **Taylor Heinicke** and **Kyle Allen** while in Carolina. Bradberry played one season with Heinicke (2018) and two seasons with Allen (2018-19).

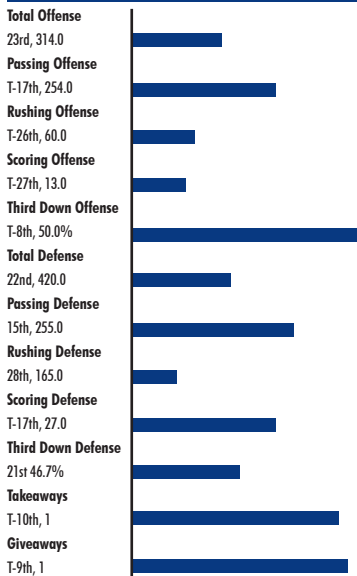


Giants LB **Oshane Ximines** is returning to the greater D.C. area, where he played college football at Old Dominion from 2014-18. Ximines played with Washington QB **Taylor Heinicke** for one season (2014) while at Old Dominion and became the first player in the school's history to be selected in the NFL Draft.

BARKLEY AGAINST WASHINGTON

Since entering the NFL in 2018, RB Saquon Barkley has been dominant against the Washington Football Team, averaging 195.7 scrimmage yards per game in his three contests against them. Among NFL players, Barkley's 195.7 scrimmage yards per game average is the second-most by a player against a single opponent (minimum two games).

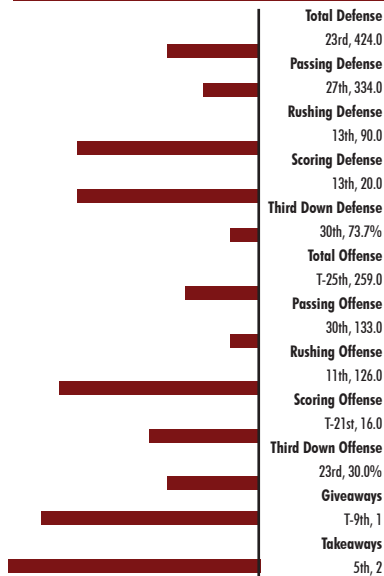

In Week 16 at Washington in 2019, Barkley set a career high with 279 scrimmage yards. He also became one of just six backs with at least 275 scrimmage yards, a rushing touchdown and receiving touchdown in one game.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Jones aims to win his fifth-consecutive game against Washington and his third in Washington. He currently holds a 100.0 passer rating in his career against them.
- Jones looks to join Dak Prescott as the only starting quarterbacks in NFC East history to win five games in their first three seasons against Washington.
- Jones will attempt to join Milt Plum and Charlie Conerly as the only NFC East quarterbacks to start and win their first five games against Washington in NFL history.
- Jones needs at least two touchdown passes to pass Ed Danowski (37) for the eighth-most passing touchdowns in Giants history/
